We have been listing August 23rd in the last several issues of the IN-GEAR as an important date in our club's history. The document shown above is the reason why. Our club received its official charter on August 23, 1961, 60 years ago. At the time of our 30th anniversary, original charter member, Past President and club historian, Don Urbanke, wrote the following: "During the summer of 1961, a man visited a clothing store in the New Hartford Shopping Center and asked to speak to the owner, Herman Abrams. He introduced himself to 'Hy' as Henry Brown, a member of the Utica Rotary Club. Henry knew that 'Hy' Abrams was the President of the Shopping Center Tenant's Association and would be a good leader in discussing the formation of a Rotary Club in New Hartford. 'Hy' was invited to attend a meeting of the Utica Rotary club the following week where he met District Governor Bob MacFarland. An evening meeting was arranged at the

home of Utica Rotarian Roger Williams and eight prospective New Hartford Rotarians attended. A movie on the history of Rotary was shown and the possibility of forming a club in New Hartford was discussed. Under the leadership of Governor Bob, Governor's representative Henry Brown and Dick Morgan, President of Utica Rotary, rapid progress was made and more men became interested. Eight of the 23 charter members were businessmen from the New Hartford Shopping Center. A provisional club was formed early in September and the charter night was scheduled to be held at Trinkaus Manor on Wednesday, October 18, 1961."

August 23rd is fast approaching and due to the uncertainty of what COVID has in store for us, we have not been able to plan a special event to celebrate our club's anniversary. However, as you can see by Don Urbanke's 30th anniversary remarks, another important date will be upon us in a few months- the 60th anniversary of Charter Night, October 18, 2021, which this year is a Monday night. Let's keep our fingers crossed and hope that COVID does not rear its ugly head and we can plan a special celebration this fall.
