Then he cut off some branches...Come on guy, make up your mind! Do you want me to have them or not? He also cut off some leaves. To make me pretty he said. Yep, he talks to the trees. Must have seen the Broadway musical "Paint your wagon" too many times. Oh, I forgot to tell you he cut off most of my roots and wired me to the container he "planted" me in. I'm not sure why he wired me to the pot, must have thought I would run away. Have YOU ever seen a tree do that? Me neither. He continued to snip, wire and make me grow in ways I didn't imagine I could. I guess he just wants me to look old and gnarly like my father was. He grew up on the coast of Maine. Life isn't bad though, I get special food and soil that keeps me going and growing. It is a good life to be a part of Bonsai.*



We are now scheduling September and far beyond!
